Your application to the Hawks' Charitable Trust will be considered by the Trustees who will assess three areas:

- 1. Sporting attainment
- 2. Financial need
- 3. Quality of your submission

Your application must be submitted by 21st April 2021.

Further guidance is outlined below.

1. Sporting attainment and aspirations

It is essential that the Trustees are provided as much detail as possible in each of your sports. You need to demonstrate what level you have competed at and when; also how often. For example, are you playing hockey for your County every week or did you just have one County game when you were at school. Try to show chronologically how your level of attainment has developed and how you have continued to progress whilst at Cambridge through competing for the University and for other recognised clubs and institutions. This relatively easy to demonstrate for someone who is playing at international level, but needs more detail for someone who plays a sport regularly for the University, but also playing regularly for a club back at home or nearby Cambridge.

We also ask you to indicate any official roles you have taken on in your club. Whilst this is not a core part of the assessment, it provides an indication of commitment.

The Trustees are interested in your short-term targets whilst at Cambridge and your longer-term aspirations.

2. Financial need

Please provide details of the costs that you incur for your sport. We assume that all applicants are paying subscriptions to their university clubs and so the Trustees are particularly interested in any additional costs that you need to incur and why.

3. Quality of your submission

You need to submit two documents:

- (i) This form completed and countersigned by your Senior Treasurer and Tutor. If you are competing for more than one club, seek support from the Senior Treasurer for the club where you are competing at the highest level of attainment.
- (ii) A cover letter explaining, in no more than 400 word why you are a suitable recipient of an award. This is your opportunity to explain, in your own words, what you have achieved in your sport, especially how you have built on your achievements since coming to Cambridge. This includes what you are doing outside university to improve your level of achievement, especially playing for club or representative teams during term and the holidays. This will help the Trustees to understand the level of commitment and hard work you have put into the attainment levels described on the form. You should also take this opportunity to explain the costs and any special financial circumstances.

If you have been accepted on the Cambridge University UCAAP scheme, please point this out.
