joins the Kingston Road, and the race passes this point after 31 miles.

Spectators desiring a short walk during the race are advised, after seeing the start, to make for the east end of Queen's Mere, and after the race has passed this point (2\frac{3}{4}\) miles) to proceed to the west end of Queen's Mere (3\frac{1}{2}\) miles) and thence to the Big Holly Bush for the finish.

By car—the race can be seen at the start, the Old Pound at Wimbledon Parkside (1\frac{1}{2}\) miles), the Big Holly Bush (3\frac{1}{4}\) miles), Beverley water splash 100 yards south of Robin Hood Gate (4\frac{1}{2}\) miles), one mile down the Kingston By-Pass Road (5\frac{1}{4}\) miles), and at the finish (7\frac{1}{4}\) miles)

and at the finish  $(7\frac{1}{2} \text{ miles})$ .

Owing to restricted accommodation members of the Thames Hare and Hounds and visitors, apart from the teams and those in attendance on them, officials and pioneers, are asked not to go into the Club's changing room.
