THE HAWKS' CLUB PRESIDENT'S REVIEW FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

In 2022-2023 the Hawks' Club capitalised on the solid foundations that were built up in the midst of considerable uncertainty during the COVID pandemic. These foundations meant that current resident member numbers continued to be strong (317 at June 2022), with the Clubhouse being a vibrant space for students to socialise and work. It has been fantastic to see people taking advantage of expanded opening hours, thanks to our new permanent Steward. The clubhouse space is increasingly being utilised by the membership – across sports clubs. Importantly our sister club The Ospreys, are increasingly using the Clubhouse with added benefits to Cambridge women's sport.

Since June 2022, numerous events have been hosted for resident members in Cambridge. There was a 'Houseparty' for returning students in Michaelmas, as well as a variety of celebrations relating to the 150th anniversary. Throughout the Lent Term, the Club Darts' Tournament took place, with over twenty teams taking part in a round robin tournament, followed by a knockout finals' night. Catering was a big improvement, with the return of Hawks' burger offerings being appreciated by members, as well as lasagne nights to fuel up before BUCS games. Club activity continued strongly after exams – the Hawks' Dublin Tour consisted of some 27 Hawks flying out on a Monday morning, doing some sightseeing, meeting up with the Trinity College Dublin Knights, and sharing their love for sport. A few days later, to cap off the academic year, the Hawks' Event was again hosted at Fenner's – another successful outing.

Engagement with alumni Hawks has continued to grow. The annual Club Golf Day at Royal Worlington was another resounding success in September 2022. The London Dinner continued in December 2022 at the Savoy, whilst the Welsh Dinner took place in the New Year. In addition, it has been great to see numerous alumni members return to the Clubhouse over the past twelve months, whether it be for a spontaneous drink, annual team reunions or the Clubhouse 30th anniversary in October 2022. There has also been the creation of an active local alumni members Whatsapp group, encouraging participation outside of organised events. Students continue to benefit from the experiences that past Varsity sportsmen and women bring and share with resident members. The continuation of the Hawks' Club newsletters has kept past members in touch with university sport, and generated further support for resident members.

The Hawks' Club is an inclusive club and is open to all sportsmen who have represented Cambridge against Oxford at sport. The Ospreys Club mirrors the ideals of the Hawks for sportswomen. The Clubhouse welcomes both Hawks and Ospreys members equally, and is a safe space to learn, help each other out, and share in the benefits that sport can bring to student welfare. Every summer a refurbishment project is undertaken to ensure the clubhouse environment is welcoming. This programme will continue every summer.

The Hawks' Club is playing a growing role in Cambridge life outside of the University, with HOATS activities offering donations to local charities where a sporting or educational connection exists.

The Club has had a strong financial year, benefiting from healthy members' subscriptions and donations, and now enjoys a healthy cash reserve. Longer serving members will remember that this financial health is a recent development and needs to be protected and embedded. Next year's President and Committee aim to continue recent progress, providing services to members, promoting sport within Cambridge University and enjoying the benefits that competitive sport can bring.
